### Welcome back and welcome to 2023!

Welcome back, we hope you had a wonderfully rejuvenating vacation! We're rested and ready to get back to work building a strong, inclusive union.

#### Good News for Schools in the Governor's Budget:

We recently learned that despite a "modest shortfall" in state funding, Governor Newsom is proposing to increase the LCFF (Local Control Funding Formula) for school districts next year by \$4.2 billion or **8.13%**, due largely to the level of inflation that we experienced over the past year.

The LCFF determines the bulk of the money that funds our schools and is unrestricted in how the districts use it. Last year, the district received over \$412 million from the state through the LCFF, and this year is budgeted to receive over \$466 million, which is about 64% overall revenues in the general fund.

#### The important things to know here:

- → The overall budget experienced a "modest shortfall" in tax dollars to fund the budget, but the state is prioritizing the direct education of our students over other costs.
- → There will be an increase in unrestricted, per-pupil funding, which means that districts like Clovis that are predicting increases in enrollment will likely see a significant increase in LCFF funding.
- → This is a huge, fully-funded COLA increase. It is the largest since the late 70s. While last year's overall funding increase was larger, that was due to both the COLA and to the augmentation that the state added on top to provide more funding to school districts under local control. This may make it look like this year's budget is small, but in historic terms, it isn't.
- → The COLA does not automatically result in an increase to salaries but can be used for that purpose. The intent of the LCFF funding is to be under local control so the state doesn't tell us what to do with it. The design is for the district, the community, and the educators to come together to address the local realities.

This is why Clovis Educators need a strong, inclusive, and independent union to lift up our voices and have a say in the long-term solutions we need in Clovis.

## Bargaining Update

- The ACE Psychologists and MHSPs have four bargaining dates this month (Friday 1/13, Friday 1/20, Monday 1/23 and Friday 1/27).
- The ACE team is working hard to win a contract that ensures our students get the mental health and special education support that they need and deserve.
