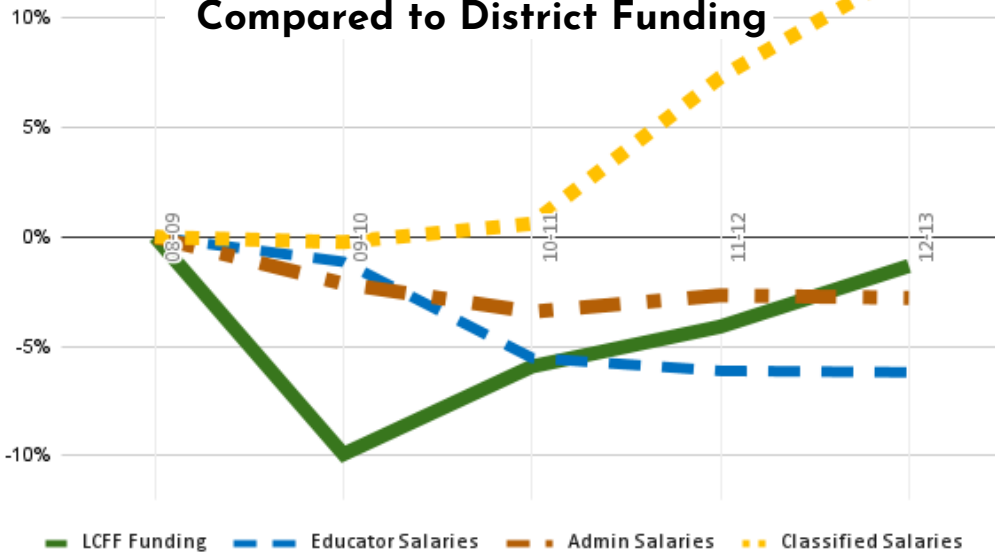


HOW DID CUSD AND FACULTY SENATE HANDLE THE GREAT RECESSION?

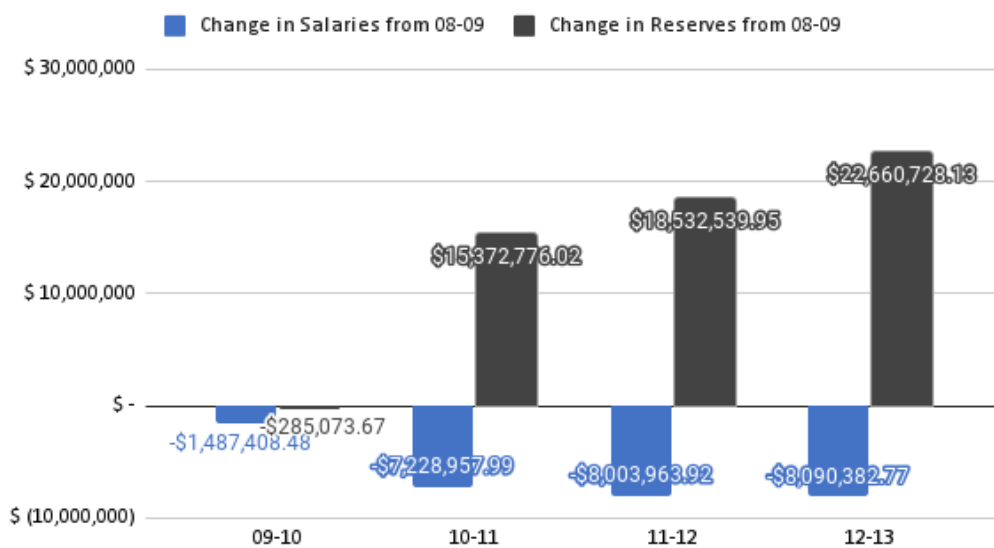


Percentage of Increase/Decrease in Payroll Costs Compared to District Funding



- During the financial crisis of the Great Recession, CUSD's spending on educators' salaries decreased, all while other employee groups were preserved.
- Class sizes increased as enrollment increased and staffing was reduced by almost 150 positions.
- Despite claiming they used reserves to protect jobs, the district only dipped into their budget by \$285,074 in 2009-10 - less than a tenth of a percent.
- The district continued to put money into reserves all while keeping cuts to the classroom.

Clovis Unified School District didn't use reserves to avoid cutting teachers, they increased their reserves by cutting educators and their pay
